From the desk of the Scribe.....

The dark side of Entebbe

4th July 2016 marked an official commemoration of one of the most inspiring rescue missions the world has ever seen – a mission that was as audacious as it was spectacular. Forty years ago, Israeli commandos flew 4000 km deep into Uganda and snatched 104 hostages from the hands of seven terrorists and hundreds of Ugandan soldiers at Entebbe airport. Following on the heels of the disastrous hostage drama at the 1972 Munich Games, few military experts would ever have predicted a successful outcome, and today the Entebbe raid is widely regarded as the most daring hostage rescue ever attempted. However, there is perhaps a darker and more tragic side to this dramatic operation – a tainted story that has never really been told.

One of the challenges faced by the Israeli commandos was the issue of fuel. The original plan was to refuel the four C130 Hercules transport planes at Entebbe, during the few minutes it would take to extract the hostages. But as the events unfolded it became clear that this option would not be feasible. The four Hercules had to leave Entebbe as soon as possible, and with no alternative option the four planes landed at Nairobi Airport in neighbouring Kenya to refuel. The entire airport was cordoned off and guarded by Kenyan security personnel. A makeshift field hospital was setup in the terminal building which included a fully equipped operating theatre. Surgery was promptly performed on three severely injured hostages, one of whom succumbed to his wounds later in a Nairobi hospital. Once the Hercules transport planes had been re-fuelled and the injured taken care of, the Israeli task force was able to continue their journey back to Israel, escorting their sacred prize: 103 exhausted, but ecstatic hostages. Numerous Israeli politicians would later admit that the mission could never have succeeded without the vital co-operation of the Kenyan government. And this is where a tragic series of events would begin to unfold.

For Idi Amin, the brutal Ugandan dictator, the Israeli raid on his home ground would prove to be one of his worst diplomatic and political failures. In fact, the humiliation it brought played a pivotal role in his downfall. In response to the attack, the man who was responsible for the deaths of at least 300000 Ugandan civilians during his eight year rule resorted to what he knew best. Revenge. A revenge which knew no bounds. His first victim was Dorah Bloch, a fact known to us all. Less well known was the assassination of South African born Agriculture Minister Bruce Mackenzie, the only white member of the Kenyan President's Cabinet. Mackenzie had been instrumental in facilitating Kenya's covert collaboration with the Israeli's. Not only did he provide for the refuelling of the Israeli aircraft and the medical care of the injured hostages, he even went as far as loaning his personal light aircraft to Mossad agents which enabled them to photograph Entebbe airport a few days prior to the raid. Two years later Amin invited Mackenzie to visit Uganda, and during his stay ordered a bomb to be planted on his plane. Minutes before it landed back in Kenya, the plane exploded over the Ngong hills.

Amin's next victims were the Entebbe air traffic controllers on duty that fateful night. Lawrence Mawanda, Mohammed Muhido and Fabian Rwengyembe were dragged to the army barracks situated at the airport. In typical Amin style, Mawamba had nails driven into his head and was bludgeoned beyond recognition with a sledgehammer. The fate of the other two was equally gruesome. The remains of their battered bodies were dumped in the Namanve forest, one of Amin's favourite killing fields. Soon after that, Amin turned on various airport security personnel with the same vengeance. Few survived.

But it gets even worse: Suspecting the collusion of the Kenyan government, Amin ordered the massacre of more than 3000 members of the Koromojong tribe, Kenyan nationals living in Uganda near the Kenyan border. And then Amin turned his attention to the Abayudaya tribe, a tribe of Jewish converts who also lived in Uganda. Although the exact casualty figures are not known, their numbers were reduced from a few thousand, to no more than 300.

Looking back now, there is absolutely no question that Israel had acted within her legal rights and in accordance with her moral obligations. But when we celebrate today and pay tribute to the 104 hostages who were liberated on that fateful day in 1976, we should not overlook the dark side of the Entebbe raid which reveals that far more innocent lives were lost than the 'few' that were saved. Not as a result of the raid, but as a consequence thereof.
